Ayatollah Borujerdi's political strategies generated significant social and political outcomes during an era of intense ideological contestation. His unifying initiatives among the National Front, the Muslim People's Combatant Association, and the Fadaian-e Islam fostered a cooperative spirit critical to confronting the Pahlavi regime and resisting foreign imperialism. Key findings include:

- 1. **Preservation of Youth from Leftist Ideologies:** Borujerdi's leadership deterred Iranian youth from gravitating toward communism, instead reinforcing clerical authority as a guardian of national identity against Western influences.
- 2. **Cross-Factional Collaboration:** His promotion of collaboration across religious and political factions created a united front, particularly during crises such as the 1953 coup, where nationalist and religious sentiments intersected.
- 3. **Constraining Authoritarianism:** His strategies helped temper some repressive measures of the Pahlavi regime, preserving the role of Islamic culture in the face of aggressive modernization.
- 4. **Pathway to Independence:** Borujerdi's emphasis on Ummatism provided momentum for movements aimed at achieving cultural, economic, and political independence.

Despite these achievements, Borujerdi faced serious challenges, especially from the radicalism of groups like Fadaian-e Islam, which threatened coalition stability. His leadership illustrates Bendix's theories in historical sociology, underscoring the significance of social alliances in navigating political change. In conclusion, Borujerdi's legacy lies in his effort to unify disparate religious and political groups, shaping a foundational chapter in modern Iranian history and exemplifying the enduring interplay between religion and politics.
